MARINE RADIO OFFICERS TRAINING

TO START YOUNG radio officers off on the right foot when they first go aboard ship, a three-week pre-sea training course has been instituted by the Marconi Marine Company. The course is held at the School of Marine Radio and Radar at Hamble, for radio officers who have obtained their Postmaster General's certificate and entered the Company's service, but have not yet begun their sea-going career.

Sons or near relatives of Marconi people wishing to become radio officers can apply for cadetships which provide financial and training assistance to suitable candidates.
